EDITORIAL

nder Kathie's enlightened editorship, the Gwinwydden/Grapevine has developed into a forum for the discussion of Christian concepts and ideas as well as providing a record of church services and births, marriages and deaths in our communities. I particularly appreciated reading the articles

by Richard Law and Chris Rees in the August issue, which discussed the Trinity and the Fall, and I would like to add some observations of my own, which are largely the fruit of teaching language and literature to GCSE and A Level pupils over a number of years.

Introducing contemporary students to Elizabethan and Jacobean literature is rather like inviting them to leap into cold seawater – the shock of the unfamiliar language is initially disorientating – but with the realisation that human nature hasn't changed over 400 years comes a sense of invigoration and vitality. Then come further questions: why were Catholics and Protestants slaughtering each other in the 17th century in much the same way that Sunni and Shiite Muslims are doing so now in the Middle East? How can an omnipotent (all-powerful) and omniscient (all-knowing) God allow the existence of suffering in the world? How can Christians reconcile the concepts of Predestination (Rhagluniaeth) and Free Will (our freedom to make our own moral choices)?

As a teacher, one must tread carefully in discussing these issues, I always let the students know where I am "coming from" – an orthodox Anglo-Catholic set of values – and invite debate, and indeed, disagreement. Over the last 30 years the number of students who have a basic knowlege of the Bible has declined to the point where even relatively simple concepts, such as the difference between the Old and New Testaments have to be explained carefully.



Why, they ask, does the diabolical tempter Mephistopheles get Dr. Faustus to condemn the doctrine of the Trinity in Marlowe's great play of the early 1590s? As Chris Rees pointed out, the Holy Trinity is implicit, if unnamed, in Paul's letter to Titus, and Richard Law reminds us that it was fully formulated by Tertullian. Perhaps the best way of understanding the Trinity is in the context of time.

With our limited and imperfect understanding, we cannot hope to comprehend the true nature of God, and who stands outside of time, as time itself is part of his own creation. Indeed we shouldn't even use pronouns such as "his" or "her". This aspect of God, which we imperfectly call "God the Father" is beyond our comprehension. God the Son was God made flesh and lived, taught and suffered with us in our world for around 30 years. The third Person of the Trinity, the Holy Spirit, the Comforter,, is with us now, and always has been for those who seek (His) help in prayer through the name of Jesus. Once again, pronouns fail us.

Chris Rees discussed the Fall in one of his articles last month. The awareness of our fallen nature, of our predisposition to do things that are selfish and injurious to others, runs through the Old Testament from Genesis onwards, certainly influencing Sigmund Freud's modelling of the human mind into id, ego and superego at the


beginning of the 20th century. It is in the New Covenant of the New Testament that we can find our liberation from the burden of guilt and sin.

I would like to end this article with two sonnets, each a meditation on our fallen nature. Firstly, John Donne addresses the Holy Trinity, "three-personed God" in prayer – the violence of his language is still shocking today, 400 years after it was written.

This is followed by Gwenallt's great 20th century sonnet, *Pechod*, which explores our fallen nature.

Batter my heart, three-personed God, for you As yet but knock, breathe, shine, and seek to mend; That I may rise, and stand, o'erthrow me, and bend I, like an usurped town, to another due, Labour to admit you, but Oh, to no end. Reason, your viceroy in me, me should defend, But is captived, and proves weak or untrue. Yet dearly I love you, and would be loved fain, But am betrothed unto your enemy: Divorce me, untie or break that knot again, Take me to you, imprison me, for I, Except you enthrall me, never shall be free, Nor ever chaste, except you ravish me.



Said Lark to Rabbit, "Up in the sky There's plenty of room And it's airy and high."



NOT BLOWING HIS OWN TRUMPET





Keep Going


