EDITORIAL

The Air India plane crash.

To some, just another breaking news story.

To me, it was a soul-stirring reminder of how fragile and unpredictable life really is.

Four lives. Four stories. Four powerful lessons that changed how I see time, purpose, and the grace of each moment.

First: A family who had waited years to fulfill their dream of migrating to the UK.

Life kept getting in the way, responsibilities, delays, decisions.

They finally made it onto the plane... but never reached their destination

And I realized:

We carry so many plans for “someday.” But if we keep waiting, someday becomes never.

Second: A woman who was supposed to be on that flight. She arrived late. Missed the check-in. Pleaded to get on board but was denied. She was frustrated, angry, defeated. Only to later realize: that delay was divine protection.

We don’t always get what we want, because God sees what we cannot. Sometimes, His “no” is what keeps us alive.

Third: A man who survived.

The plane split in half and he happened to be in the section that didn’t catch fire.

He walked away, dazed and alive, from something no one thought survivable.

It wasn’t luck. It was purpose. And I was reminded of the verse: “There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens.” – Ecclesiastes 3:1

It simply wasn't his time.

Fourth: And then those who didn't make it. People with dreams. People with families. People with unfinished stories.

They kissed someone goodbye that morning... not knowing it was the last time.

Their lives remind us that time is not guaranteed. We're not promised old age. We're not promised later. What we have is now. A breath. A heartbeat. A chance.

So while you still have today..

While you're still breathing, still strong, still able, don't waste it. Don't wait for the "perfect" moment.

Love now. Apologize now. Forgive now. Dream now. Speak now.

Because life doesn't always come with warnings. And sometimes... "next time" never comes.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE CARDI BACH RAILWAY

The Vale of Taf Railway, Whitland and Cardigan Railway, The Cardi Bach.

Thank you for this opportunity to contribute to your magazine with a brief history of the beginnings of the Cardi Bach Railway.

We must go back to the year 1870 when a gentleman by the name of John Owen returned to his native village of Glog after spending many years as a draper in London. John was the son of Glog Farm, who were also the owners of Glog Slate Quarry, which was at the time a flourishing business. John realized after seeing the railway networks of the capital that a railway would be of great benefit to transport the slate and also the Llanfyrnach silver and lead mine products from the area.

John Owen therefore set about raising money to start the huge project of a railway from Whitland along the Taf vale to Crymych. In fact it was a great success and within three years, in 1873 there was a train carrying goods from Whitland to Crymych. By 1875 a passenger service was also opened to Crymych which we are celebrating on the 12th of July 2025 at the Cardi Bach Heritage Centre, Login. Please come and join us to celebrate 150 years of the official opening.





So the railway had reached Crymych as a goods and passenger service in only five years from the start of the project proving the enthusiasm of John Owen as the leader of the project. Although pleased with the development there was more work to do as John Owen wanted to complete his dream of completing a railway all the way to the coast at Cardigan. So a prospectus was published to raise money to complete the line but as the river Taf had its source at Crymych the difficulties of planning were numerous, but again success for John Owen and George Slumper, the engineer, as the line was opened to Cardigan by 1886 and re named The Whitland to Cardigan Railway. As John Owen realized his dream of reaching Cardigan it was in the same year he passed away. His grave stone and a commemorative stone are at Llwyn yr Hwrdd Chapel, Tegryn. As the sound of the train whistle became part of life for those villages along the railway the inhabitants gave it their own title name, which is still used to this day, The Cardi Bach.

During the late 50's and early 60's the smaller rural railways were in decline and the axe finally fell on the passenger service on September the 10th 1962, with the goods ending on May 27, 1963. Track lifting began in December 1963, and was completed by July 1964. The land was sold to respective farmers which is today making it very difficult to gain right of way for walkers and cyclists, although there are plans afoot.

Much historical interest in the old railway has been shown in the last ten years or so. This began when Cilgerran Language and Heritage Committee arranged an exhibition in 2012. Hundreds turned up proving that there was enough interest to begin a society in the area. At the same time Peter and Dawn Towns moved into Login Station, and the society worked with them to establish the Heritage Centre, which now has become a popular attraction for all ages.

Archive films have also been found, and have been shown at Theatr Mwldan, Cardigan, annually raising funds for the Cardi Bach Railway Society.

Following the formation of the society the author of the Whitland to Cardigan book, M.R.C Price, brought out the third edition of his book, which is a comprehensive history of the line from beginning to end. So if you wish to learn more, there are copies available at Awen Teifi book shop at Cardigan.

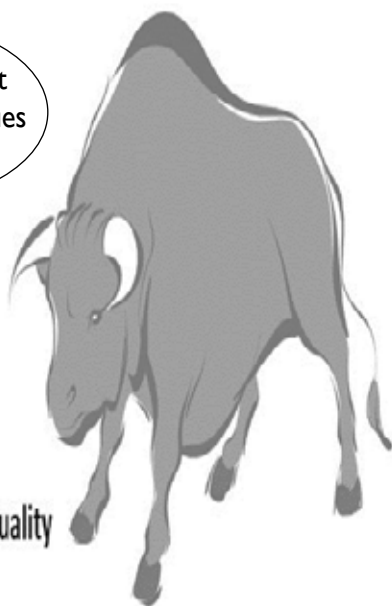

HAZELNUT COCOA OAT BISCOTTI

All you need is:

$\frac{3}{4}$ cup all-purpose flour

$\frac{1}{4}$ cup oat flour

$\frac{1}{4}$ cup unsweetened cocoa powder

$\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon baking powder

Pinch of salt

$\frac{1}{3}$ cup sugar

1 egg

1 tablespoon melted butter or coconut oil

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

$\frac{1}{3}$ cup chopped hazelnuts

Optional: mini chocolate chips or dusting of powdered sugar

Method

Mix flour, oat flour, cocoa, baking powder, salt, and sugar.

In another bowl, whisk egg, melted butter, and vanilla.

Combine wet and dry, then fold in hazelnuts.

Shape into a flat log on parchment and bake at 350°F or 180C for 20–22 minutes.

Let cool, slice into biscotti, and bake again at 325°F or 170C for 10–12 minutes on each side.

Cool completely before storing.
