#### **EDITORIAL**

#### The Advent Season

I love the season of Advent, the anticipated build up to Christmas. A time of reflection when we put aside the hustle and bustle of Christmas preparations and think about the true meaning of Christmas and of preparing ourselves for the coming of Jesus Christ as the Light of the World into our own lives.

I enjoy making an Advent Crown each Christmas, which symbolises the passage of the four weeks of Advent. The concept of the Advent wreath originated in Germany in the 16th century, but it was not until three centuries later that the modern Advent Crown took shape. The custom gained ground among Protestant churches and evolved into the smaller wreath with four candles that we know today.

Advent wreaths are circular, representing God's infinite love, and usually made from evergreen leaves representing 'The Hope of Eternal Life brought by Jesus Christ'. The wreath holds four candles, the four weeks of the Advent season, symbolising the Christian concepts of hope, peace, joy and love, with the white Christ's candle, which is lit on Christmas Eve, in the centre.

The most popular colours of the candles in the circle are three violet, and one pink, corresponding with the liturgical vestments for the Sundays of Advent. On the first Sunday of Advent the first purple candle lit is for the prophets who foretold the coming of Jesus into the world, and for John the Baptist. On the second Sunday the pink candle is lit for Mary, representing the journey Joseph and Mary made into Bethlehem. On the third Sunday a purple candle is lit for the Shepherds and the joy they shared, and on the fourth Sunday the Angel's candle is lit representing Peace.

In other Protestant churches in the UK, it is more common for Advent wreathes to have four red candles, each candle representing those looking forward to the coming of Christ. The hope of all God's people (week one), the Old Testament prophets (week two), John the Baptist (week three) and Mary the mother of Jesus (week four).

In an Orthodox Christian home, a wreath consists of six different coloured candles on a round base to celebrate the six weeks of the 40-day Advent and Christmas period. A green candle is lit first, symbolising Faith, then a blue candle for Hope, a gold candle Love, and a white candle for Peace. Then of the fifth Sunday a purple candle for is lit for Repentance followed by a red candle for Communion.

However you celebrate Advent and the Christmas season this year, I wish you all a very Happy Christmas and a Blessed New Year.





#### A CHURCHWARDEN REMEMBERS . . . .

Our Visit to Egypt was as a result of booking with "Air Egypt" for our flight to East Africa. Like most national carriers Air Egypt has their capital city as a "hub" and flights either start or finish there. If we were changing planes in Cairo why not take a few days out for a quick tour.

As a beekeeper, I was aware that the Ancient Egyptians were proficient beekeepers. Two honey pots were found by Howard Carter in Tutankhamun's tomb in the Valley of the Kings. I had previously enquired in the British Museum about these honey pots and whilst they photocopied a lot of interesting information, I was redirected to the Ashmolean Museum in Oxford. Oxford This museum is University's Museum of Art and Archaeology. Opened in 1683, it is the oldest public museum in the UK. Within





this organization is the Griffiths Institute; the guardian of Howard Carter's notes and sketches concerning his discoveries.

There are two types of honeybees in the middle East. There is a small bee (about the size of a fly), and a big bee. It is the big bee that we would recognise as being like honeybees we see in our gardens in Wales. The little bee builds a similar honeycomb structure but in the open usually around the branch of a tree, but it has the habit of absconding, so is not much use

for honey production. The ancient Egyptians kept their bees in clay pipes lying on their side.

There is a strange verse in the Bible concerning bees. God warns the people of Israel through the prophet Isaiah of the consequences of their waywardness.

"In that day, the Lord will whistle for flies from the Nile delta in Egypt and for bees from the land of Assyria." (Isaiah 7: 18)

Was it possible to control bees by whistling; perhaps in a similar way to that of an Indian snake charmer might control his snake? There are tomb drawings of beekeepers at work but with the passage of time they are rather indistinct. If this is true, modern beekeepers have lost this technique and use smoke to calm their bees before moving the hive or taking honey from them.

Tutankhamun's honey pots are not regal. They are ordinary honey pots that any ancient Egyptian housewife might buy. The shape of one of the Honey Pots is strange in that the base is pointed. In death the deceased were expected to go on a boat journey. The pointed base of the pot would fit in a corresponding hole in the table; so, it would not move if the boat rocked.

Because of the narrow neck of one of the containers, I confess at first, I did not believe they were honey pots. "How do you know they are honey pots? I questioned"

"I can read what is says" was the reply from the Egyptologist. The average temperature in Egypt is much higher than in the UK and so the honey would remain liquid for a lot longer. In addition to naming the contents of the pots, is the quantity, which is too indistinct to translate with any certainty and lastly the date it was bottled. "Third month of the summer season day six." It wasn't the EU who invented date stamping food.

Humankind has been enjoying the benefits of honey for thousands of years and it looks set to continue for some time to come.

My mind went back to those services in my childhood, especially those attended at my Sunday School Church, Kingston-upon Thames Congregational Church, then with the Girl Guides in All Saints Church, Kingston.

Kingston is a smallish market town, and a 'canon' was fired from the roof of the Guildhall (site of the Coronation Stone of seven Anglo-Saxon kings). Being a wimp, I hated the sounds of guns, fireworks — anything noisy, and dreaded the two mega-bangs marking the start and end of the 2 minute silence. I still won't blow up balloons. The Parish Church service was impressive. We all marched from the Guildhall to the Church. Accompanied by the Sea Scouts band. The Mayor took the salute, and of course sat in the front pew in church.

As the years have passed I have marked the day in a variety of places – Churches, war memorials, and for the past 27 years, locally here, mainly in Crymych. Today despite the horrible weather the Market Hall was again full – so many faces I've come to know over the years. And it came to me that almost certainly most people there knew and were probably related to someone whose name appears on the memorial. The parts that move me most are when the names of all on the memorial are once again voiced in the village they knew so well – and then there is a chance for the names of those not included on the memorial to be spoken aloud once more. We will remember them. May they rest in peace and rise in glory.


