EDITORIAL

Mothering Sunday

Mothering Sunday – the fourth Sunday of Lent- offers families an opportunity to honour the women who have nurtured them. Lots of different streams and traditions have come together to make today’s Mothering Sunday the special day that it is.

In the Middle Ages it was an occasion for everyone to visit their ‘mother’ church – the place where they had been baptised. Later, an opportunity for those who worked away from home to visit their mothers became added to the mix of reasons to make it a special day.

Today we honour all women who have in one way or another been special to us, and in church this is usually signalled by small bunches of flowers for every woman present.

Treating mums and grans to Sunday lunch, chocolates and flowers is also part of the present mix. And will there be a simnel cake to be seen? – a tradition from ages past – with its rich layers of marzipan, and eleven balls of marzipan on top, reminders of the 11 disciples who remained faithful to Jesus?

Not everyone has enjoyed a wonderful or enduring relationship with their mum, so lest we get carried away on a wave of love and sentimentality, there is usually space in the Mothering Sunday church service to reflect on and pray for those whose relationships with their mother were not all they might have been.

Also, there are the families blighted by the lack of, or death of a child; families remembering a mum who died tragically young; women who never had a child but would have dearly loved the opportunity; all these and more are a recognition of the imperfections of human love, human life.

These imperfections can be brought in prayer to the God who mothers us. In the Old Testament, Isaiah speaks of God comforting His people like a mother hen. In the New Testament, both Matthew and Luke bear witness to Jesus expressing His desire to gather His people as a mother hen gathers her chicks under her wings. Yes, God has strong maternal qualities which He invites us to discover and enjoy!

Have you discovered the mothering, nurturing, maternal qualities which God offers to all people? It's lovelier than flowers, more long-lasting than simnel cake, better than a visit from family, and it's free to everyone who wants it – it could be yours!

Hope all Mother's enjoy their special day on Sunday 15th March.

Saint David: Patron Saint of Wales



Saint David (Dewi Sant), the patron saint of Wales, is believed to have been born between 500 and 520 AD near St Bride’s Bay in Pembrokeshire, at Capel Non—now a place of pilgrimage associated with healing and prayer. Tradition holds that the dramatic circumstances of his birth signalled a life of spiritual significance.

Educated at the monastery of Hen Fynw under St Paulinus, David became known for his discipline, humility, and deep devotion to prayer and study. His commitment to an ascetic way of life—marked by vegetarianism and abstaining from alcohol—earned him the name Dewi Ddyfrwr, “David the Water Drinker.”

Many accounts speak of miracles attributed to him, including restoring sight to his teacher Paulinus and raising a child from the dead. One of the bestknown stories tells how, while preaching to a large crowd at Llanddewi Brefi, the ground beneath him rose so all could see and hear him clearly;

a white dove is said to have descended upon his shoulder, an image now familiar in depictions of the saint.

David founded numerous monasteries across Wales, Cornwall, and Brittany, including the community at what is now St Davids. These houses followed a strict Celtic monastic rule focused on prayer, manual labour, and simplicity. In keeping with his emphasis on humility and service, David famously required his monks to plough the fields without the aid of oxen, reminding them that each person should embrace the work set before them.

He later became Bishop of St Davids and is thought to have served as Archbishop of Wales. David is believed to have died around 589–601 AD, traditionally on 1 March. His final words—“Be joyful, keep the faith, and do the little things” (Gwnewch y pethau bychain)—remain a cherished part of Welsh spiritual heritage, encouraging Christians to seek holiness in everyday acts of kindness and faithfulness.

Canonized in 1120 by Pope Calixtus II, Saint David continues to inspire believers with his example of prayer, simplicity, and steadfast devotion.

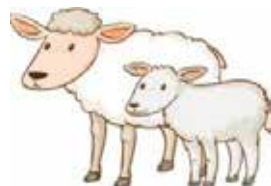
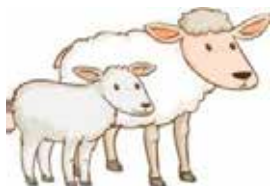

Hidden Pembrokeshire



Step quietly into the heart of the Preseli Hills, where time folds over itself and stone meets story. Here stands a mysterious Neolithic chamber, known both as Arthur's Table and the hauntingly evocative Gwal y Filiast, the "Lair of the Grey Hound Bitch." Four massive upright stones hold aloft a huge capstone, forming a polygonal chamber beneath, a silent room carved by hands long vanished, yet still pulsing with the whispers of the past.

Once, in the 19th Century, a fifth upright stone was recorded leaning eastward, perhaps marking the original entrance, facing the gentle murmur of the River Taf flowing through the valley below. Nearby, two solitary monoliths stand on the eastern slope, silent sentinels, perhaps the gateway to a hidden passage into the chamber itself. Records speak of a mound covering the tomb, its edges traced by over 30 kerbstones, though today nature has reclaimed the hill, leaving only subtle traces of the structure's once grand presence. The enormous capstone points east, toward the Taf and the far horizon of the Preseli Hills, a silent compass to a landscape both ancient and sacred, now framed by a living wall of trees.

Yet the stones are not the only keepers of stories here. The Welsh tell of Ceridwen, goddess of transformation and poetic inspiration, who brewed a magical potion in her cauldron of Awen. Her brew was meant to grant her son, Morfran, unmatched wisdom and genius, but fate had other plans. Young Gwion Bach, her servant, accidentally tasted three drops of the potion and was instantly imbued with the knowledge Ceridwen had reserved for her son.

What followed was a chase woven from magic itself, Gwion became a hare, Ceridwen a greyhound, and they raced down to the river. In a final, astonishing twist, Ceridwen transformed into a hen and swallowed him as a grain of wheat. Yet from this impossible act, life emerged, when the child was born, she could not kill him, and instead cast him into the sea, where he was found and grew into the legendary bard Taliesin, whose words would echo through Welsh history and poetry for centuries to come.

Walking among the stones of Arthur's Table, you can almost feel the pulse of that story beneath your feet, the collision of human craft, the sweep of the natural world, and the flickering magic of myth. The wind through the trees carries whispers of the River Taf, the rise and fall of distant hills, and perhaps, if you listen closely, the echo of a bard's first breath of inspiration. This is more than a burial chamber. It is a threshold, a place where history, legend, and imagination meet, a reminder that some stories, like these stones, endure far longer than any human lifetime.

A Prayer from the Past

Margaret (Askew) Fox 1614 – 1702

Margaret was the elder daughter of John and Margaret Askew of Marsh Grange in Lancashire. She was married twice. Firstly, to Thomas Fell of Swarthmoor Hall, in Lancashire with whom she had eight children.

She met George Fox when he visited Swarthmoor Hall and was persuaded to join the Quaker movement. She was imprisoned for her faith after a trial at Lancashire Assizes. Whilst imprisoned she wrote many pamphlets including 'Women speaking Justified' in which she argues that women should have the same rights as men to speak at religious services.

She married George Fox in 1669 at Bristol. She died at Swarthmoor Hall in April 1702 and left this prayer.

Let us love the constancy of your light, O Lord and rejoice in it. Let us walk in the brightness of your light, and be blessed by it. Let us live in the glory of your light, O Lord, and be judged by it. Amen

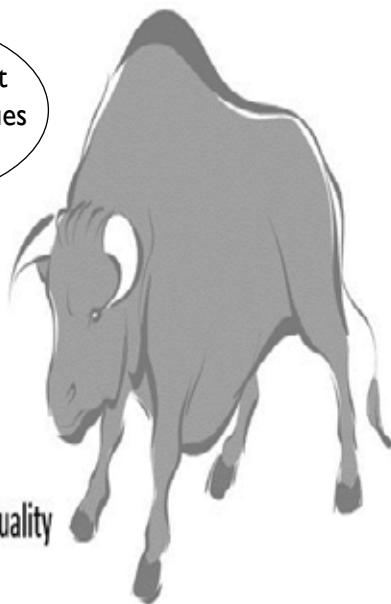

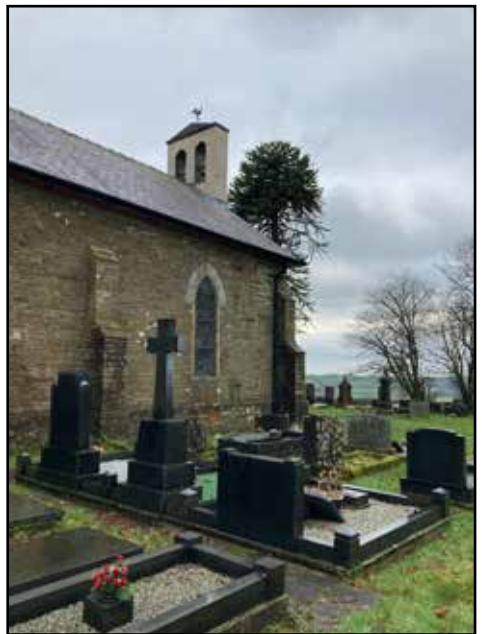
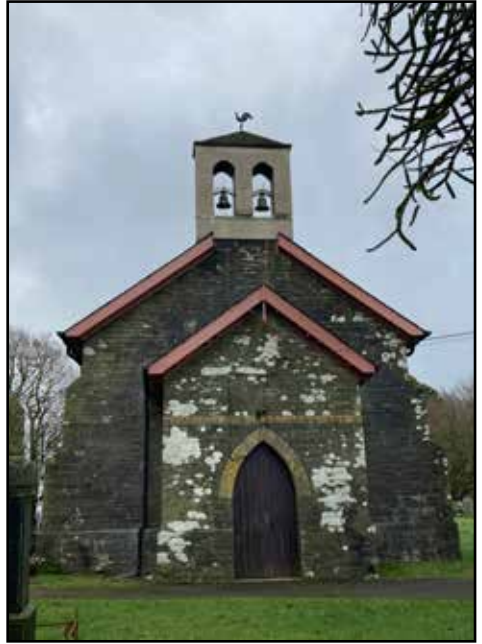
The scaffolding is 95% down now. The bell tower and external trim look stunning. And the daffodils are peeking out! Come see!
